## Following God's Call

Last night Lynn, the boys and I went to hear Doug Pagitt and a musician named Heather Lyn. Doug Pagitt is a pastor and author who recently wrote the book *Flipped*. The book is about the sayings of Jesus that seem paradoxical or are a flip. "Whoever finds their life will lose it, and whoever loses their life for my sake will find it". Matthew 10:39. "The first shall be last". Mark 10:31. He was a passionate speaker encouraging us to think more openly about our relationship with God. He was the third of contemporary prophets to visit Madison this winter. In January Nadia Bolz Weber, the heavily tattooed ELCA pastor led a workshop at First Baptist Church. Shane Claiborne and Doug Pagitt made it to Madison just this week. All three contemporary prophets interpret our culture's shift away from the established church as an opportunity to more faithfully live out the Gospel. I agree. It has been a delight to be here at St. Mark's as we have talked about how we want to grow our spiritual lives rather than spend endless hours discussing the color of tiles for the basement floor. As I remember the meeting we chose tile color was over within minutes and we have been very happy with the result.

One of the benefits of imagining church beyond the boundaries of the established church is an opportunity to be more faithful, more like Jesus to not let the "business" of church get in the way. On March 22<sup>nd</sup> Rev. Erik Jelnik, the Director of Mission for the South Central Synod will be coming to St. Mark's to preach. After worship we will have a meeting to explore new ministry opportunities. Please come on that day and welcome him and be a part of this conversation. It is a good step forward that he can be with us, representing the Synod and being a part of our hopes for the future. By then it will be spring, a tangible reminder of God's efforts at renewal for all of Creation.
