## The Resurrection in a Broken World

I was concerned by the media hype surrounding the release of the Department of Justice report concerning the police shooting of Tony Robinson. There were some who thought the report would so declarative that people would either rejoice in the streets or the protests would resume larger and with more energy. Instead, the report has been passed on to the District Attorney's office and they will have to study it before any conclusions are made. What we know is that while the report may shed new light on the Tony Robinson incident we have to do more as a community to make opportunities for all people. We have to ask our police department to be less military and more community service. Lynn and I stopped to help a man last Brat Fest who was clearly intoxicated and also white. I was shocked at the "swat team" approach by the police officer who arrived when we called the paramedics. There has to be a better way of working with people.

As we walk with Jesus through the events of Holy Week and into Easter we see Jesus modeling how to confront those in power with love. We see that even though Jesus was a master at loving confrontation there were still those so threatened by Jesus' way they determined that he had to be killed. Jesus carried a deep belief in God's kingdom where everyone is included. Jesus' loving approach in confronting the powers and principalities gives us a vision for creating community. If and when we live as Jesus did, our community will change.

Every Holy Week we have to decide whether we have the courage to follow Jesus to the cross – believing in a better vision for our lives and our community. In God's time, we celebrate the resurrection – whether we are ready for it or not.
