How Being Thankful Changes Your Brain:

Last Sunday in worship we talked about how prayer changes your brain. I said that researches have documented how when believers pray that blood rushes to the parietal lobe of the brain. The parietal lobe is in charge of perception and vision. When we pray, our personal and corporate journeys become clearer. We have a better sense of what God is calling us to. We can see or perceive more clearly what is going on in our lives and how we can get where we want to go.

Our brains also change when we practice gratitude. As this is the season of gratitude we can be trendy and improve our brain health all at the same time! Researchers have discovered that keeping a gratitude journal made people happier, more determined, had better sleep patterns and lowered depression. When people experience gratitude there is an increase in the hypothalamus activity. The hypothalamus controls essential body functions including exercise. Being thankful helps us stick to patterns of exercise that are beneficial to us. Who would have thought that praying and being thankful could have such a positive impact on our brains?! What a great way to prepare for a genuine Thanksgiving, by praying and being grateful for all of the good that is in our lives.

Two things I am thankful for:
