### ELCA Churchwide Assembly Highlights Pastor Lisa Nelson

Here are some highlights from my two days at the ELCA Churchwide Assembly in Milwaukee. I wasn't a voting member but participated in the celebration of the ordination of women. The Assembly was held August 5-10, 2019.

First of all, the worship was amazing, especially the worship celebrating the ordination of women. 400 clergy women processed into the worship space to join the almost 1000 people already present.

Secondly, Bishop Elizabeth Eaton was reelected as bishop. She became the first woman presiding bishop of the ELCA in 2013. (The presiding bishop is the leader of the entire ELCA or Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.)

#### **TOGETHER, WE CELEBRATED:**

#### The 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Ordination of Women in the Predecessor Bodies of the ELCA

It's really next year in 2020, but we don't have another Churchwide Assembly until 2022.

April Larson attended this Churchwide Assembly, as did Elizabeth Platz, the first woman ordained in the Lutheran Church in America—one of our predecessor bodies. Barbara Andrews was the first woman ordained in the American Lutheran Church, another predecessor body, and has since passed away. (The ELCA was formed on January 1, 1988)

St Mark's was the first congregation in Madison to call a woman: Andrea Degroot Nesdahl in 1978, who later became the second bishop of a synod in the ELCA in 1995. Bishop April Larson became the first bishop of a synod in the ELCA in 1992.

# The 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Ordination of Women of Color in the ELCA

Lydia Rivera Kalb was the first Latina woman and Earlean Miller was the first woman of African descent to be ordained in the Lutheran Church in America in 1979. In October of 2018, there were 2,979 women active in the ordained ministry of the ELCA. 289 of them were women of color.

In 2019, eight women were elected synod bishops, raising the number of women bishops in the ELCA to 23. In 2001, Margarita Martinez was the first woman of color and first Latina woman to be elected as a synod bishop. In 2018, Patricia A. Davenport and Viviane Thomas-Breitfeld were the first women of African descent to be elected as synod bishops.

#### The 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Ordination of LGBTQIA+ People in Committed & Monogamous Relationships, Now Called Marriage, in the ELCA

The ELCA ordained LGBTQIA+ folks before this, but they could not be in a sexual relationship. Now they can be in such relationships as long as they're married.

### What Does "LGBTQIA+" Mean?

- L Lesbian: Homosexual females.
- G Gay: Homosexuality, a homosexual person, or a homosexual male.
- B Bisexual: Refers to a person who is attracted to two sexes/genders.
- T Trans: Refers to a person whose identity and gender does not correspond with the gender assigned at birth.
- Q Queer/Questioning: all of those who are not heterosexual and/or cisgender. (Cisgender means a person identifies with the gender they were assigned at birth.)
- I Intersex: a person with indeterminate mix of primary and secondary sex characteristics.
- A Asexuality: a person with no or little sexual attraction to others.
- + All the other possibilities for sexuality, sexes, and genders not included above.
